I was many years into my nursing career when I became a BNF member and then learned about the scholarship money available to members. I must admit, I was impressed at the stewardship demonstrated by BNF. Did you know that the financial donations received toward each scholarship are invested through a Christian foundation? Or that annually a portion of the interest from each investment is made available to fund that year's scholarships? Do you know why the framework for the two scholarships available to our members is missional?

This is because BNF demonstrates what it believes in that one of the purposes for which it was established is "missional". This purpose is carried out when members lives are centered on being a witness for Jesus Christ. And within our profession of nursing, we have the great privilege of joining with God in His work in the world while serving those who have physical and spiritual needs. It is very humbling to stand on the shoulders of those who have demonstrated the wisdom and foresight to honor and serve God by being intentional. As a result, there are two "missional" scholarships, the Ellen D. Tabor Endowment and the Student Nurse Endowment, available to our members.

The Tabor Endowment provides monies for our Southern Baptist Missionaries to attend annual BNF meetings, acquire CEU's or additional training, and assists members to carry out healthcare ministry projects. The Student Nurse Endowment assists students who are dedicated to a career in missions with scholarship money toward the cost of nursing school or with ministry projects. The guidelines and applications for these scholarships have recently been reviewed and will be posted on the website in the very near future.

In the interim, should one wish to receive a copy of the guidelines and/or a scholarship application, please email Judy Dillow at jdillow@att.net with your request or question and I will ensure that you are sent what you need as soon as possible. Because of the pandemic causing delays in educational offerings, school schedules and potential mission opportunities, the deadline to apply for either of the scholarships has been extended from February 1st to March 1st. ### MY FIRST EXPERIENCE AT A BNF SUMMIT

My name is Roberto Lugo. I am a Puerto Rican nurse based in the city of New Orleans for the past three years. Despite being a part of the Southern Baptist Convention for the past eleven years, it was not until two years ago that I heard about the Baptist Nursing Fellowship.

I made the decision to attend the Summit because I wanted to know more about BNF. This is the first time I have heard of a Christian nursing organization and I wanted to learn more about what it was about. During the time it lasted, I had the opportunity to share with other brothers and sisters in Christ, who, like me, are nurses and wish to put their profession at the service of the Kingdom.

When I was a teenager, I had a passion for serving Christ as a missionary. I had a very romantic idea that I saw myself dying for the Gospel's cause in some Islamic country. If it had been in my power, I would have dropped out of school and gone to serve as a missionary at the age of 14, but my father would not let me. However, he did not discourage me. On the contrary, he said, "Why don't you become a health professional? That way, you could serve people and practically demonstrate the Gospel of Christ." That was how from early in my adolescence, I was clear that I would serve people within the field of health. It was for this reason that I became a nurse.

Although life circumstances were not what I dreamed of in my teens, for many years, I was able to serve Christ as a church planter for the SBC and as an emergency room nurse in the city of San Germán, Puerto Rico.

As an ordained Southern Baptist minister, I am a fan of our iconic Christmas and Easter offerings, focused on sustaining missionaries from NAMB and IMB: The Lottie Moon and Annie Armstrong Offerings. To my surprise, the Summit was held at the WMU headquarters. There, I had the opportunity to see some of these two women's belongings, which are on display.

What impressed me the most about the Summit was learning that BNF is the only mission-focused professional nursing organization globally. Knowing that our members are actively involved in missions revived a zeal like that I had as a child.

I am excited to be a part of BNF. I really want to get involved in short term missions where I can use my profession as an instrument of blessing to others. As a father and husband, I want my wife and children to get involved in missions. In the same way, I want to find ways in which the church I attend can be involved with BNF and together we can look for alternative ways to share the Gospel in New Orleans.
